Charles McGoldrick

On this day, 16th September 1916, Private **Charles McGoldrick** of New South Wales, Australia, died of wounds in Northampton War Hospital in England. Before the war he was a miner. He was photographed with his pregnant wife and little girl, Irene Ada, before he left Australia in April 1916 to serve as a soldier.

Just four months later, in battle near Pozières on the Somme, France, he was shot in the thigh. Doctors in France and then in the UK tried to save him, but he died of his injuries and pneumonia after his leg was amputated.

His wife asked his headstone to be engraved: HE DIED FOR KING AND COUNTRY / A BRAVE YOUNG LIFE / NOBLY ENDED

Key facts – Australia in the First World War

- As part of the British Empire, Australia went with Britain to war
- In 1914, the Australian population was less than five million. Some **324,000 men enlisted** and served overseas. Over **61,000 died**
- Australian troops served from 1915-1918 in Turkey, the Middle East and Europe
- The small **Royal Australian Navy served** under the command of the Royal Navy
- Key battles: Gallipoli (Turkey), Fromelles, Pozieres, Bullecourt, Advance to Victory (France), Messines and Passchendaele (Belgium)

George Mann

Private **George Mann** enlisted in Manchester and served in the Machine Gun Corps, Heavy Branch. This unit manned the very first tanks. His tank, D6, had failed to reach the starting point that day, getting stuck in a support trench.

After it was dug out, it proceeded on and into the village of Guedecourt but was stopped again at Grid trench when it got stuck on an obstacle. Two of the crew got out to find out what was the problem, but the tank took a direct hit from artillery fire.

Private George Mann was killed on the 16th September, aged 22, with all his crew. The Tank Corps' nickname was 'the Suicide Club' on account of their high casualties.

George Mann is remembered on the **Thiepval Memorial**.

- More than 1.5 million volunteered to serve, with a further 1.5 million conscripted after 1916

One Day... One Story...

Harold J Hogg



On this day, 16th September 1916, Private **Harold J. Hogg** of the Canadian Infantry was killed in action. He was 27.

Harold was born in the UK and raised in Nottingham. He was one of at least ten children born to Henry and Rose Hogg. Exactly ten years before war was declared, Harold, seven siblings, his mother and aunt arrived in Canada, probably joining his father who may have gone first to look for work. They settled on a farm in south-eastern Saskatchewan.

In 1915 he joined the Canadian Infantry, arriving in England in December for training at Bramshott before going to France in February 1916. He served on the Western Front until his death, in action, in the Battle of Flers-Courcelette.

Key facts – Canada in the First World War

- As parts of the British Empire, Canada and Newfoundland went with Britain to war
- In 1914, the Canadian population was just under eight million. Some **650,000** men and women from Canada and Newfoundland enlisted to serve during the war. More than **66,000** died
- Approx **4,000 Aboriginal Canadians** enlisted – nearly 1/3 of all Aboriginal-Canadian men eligible to serve. More than **2,800 nursing sisters** served in the Canadian Army Medical Corps
- Key battles: 2nd Ypres, Passchendaele (Belgium); France: the Somme (esp. 1 July for Newfoundlanders, Flers-Courcelette for Canadians), Vimy and the Advance to Victory

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Ghulam Mohi-u-Din

On this day, 16th September 1916, Bearer **Ghulam Mohi-u-Din** of the Indian Army Bearer Corps died. We care for his grave in Daours Communal Cemetery Extension near the River Somme in France.

We don't know anything about his life before the army, or when he joined. He was attached to the Mhow Cavalry Field Ambulance when he died, which was part of the 1st Indian Cavalry Division, one of two which continued to serve on the Western Front when the rest of the Indian contingent were redeployed to Mesopotamia (now Iraq) in late 1915.

Army bearers carried the sick and wounded and did general military hospital work as required. Indian cavalry units served on the Somme, and Ghulam Mohi-u-Din could have died of wounds received while stretcher-bearing. But he could also have died of sickness or in an accident. He was laid to rest alongside seven other Indian cavalrymen, the last Indian to be buried in this cemetery.

Key facts – India and the First World War

- As part of the British Empire, India went with Britain to war
- The Indian Army was over **160,000 strong** in 1914. Almost 1.5 million **Muslim, Sikh and Hindu** men from what was British India volunteered to serve
- The Indian Army was the most wide-spread army of the war, serving across what would be some **50 countries** today, across Africa, the Middle East and Europe. It was vital to Allied success
- Key battles: October-November 1914, 2nd Ypres in 1915 (Belgium), Neuve Chapelle and Loos (France); the East African Campaign; Kut, Baghdad and Sharquat (Iraq); 3rd Krithia & Sari Bair (Turkey); Sinai & Palestine Campaign
- Nearly **74,000 Indian servicemen** died in the First World War

Hēnare Kōhere



On this day, 16th September 1916, Second Lieutenant **Hēnare Kōhere** died aged 36. Born in New Zealand, the grandson of a Māori chief, Hēnare represented his province at rugby.

After school, he helped run the family farm and led the Māori contingent which attended the coronation of Edward VII in London to perform the haka. He was married and had three children. Tragically his wife died after just five years of marriage. In 1915 he volunteered to join the army and became an officer in the **New Zealand Pioneer Battalion**. He wrote to his young children, 'It won't be long before you see Papa again.'

Pioneer Battalions worked hard, often under enemy fire, to create and maintain vital things like front-line trenches, roads, light railways, communication cables and drainage systems. On 14 Sept, Hēnare was wounded by a German shell while the New Zealanders were preparing to launch a major attack on the Somme. He died of his wounds two days later in a mobile army hospital (casualty clearing station) at Heilly Station on the Somme.

Key facts – New Zealand in the First World War

- As part of the British Empire, New Zealand went with Britain to war
- In 1914, the New Zealand population was just over one million. Over **100,000 people** enlisted and served overseas. More than **18,000 died**
- New Zealand troops served in Turkey, the Middle East and Europe, and their small naval force was incorporated into the Royal Navy
- Key battles: Gallipoli (Turkey); Sinai & Palestine; Flers-Courcelette on the Somme, Le Quesnoy (France), Messines and Passchendaele (Belgium)

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Andrew Haldane Murray

On this day, 16th September 1916, Lieutenant **Andrew Haldane Murray** of the 7th South African Horse was killed in action. He was 49. He left a wife and three children, the youngest aged 12, near Graaf-Reinet in South Africa.

Born in Wellington, South Africa, to an influential church minister, Haldane studied at Cambridge before returning to South Africa to work as a teacher, headmaster, school inspector and farmer. As soon as war was declared he volunteered, serving in German South-West Africa and then East Africa where he was Mentioned in Despatches.

He was buried near where he fell in a remote district of Tanzania. His wife refused to allow his grave to be moved; it is now lost, but we commemorate him with a special memorial headstone in our Morogoro Cemetery in Tanzania.

Key facts – South Africa in the First World War

- As part of the British Empire, South Africa went with Britain to war
- South African units – military and military labour - served in German South-West Africa (now Namibia) and in the campaign in East Africa, on the Western Front, in Egypt and in Palestine
- More than 11,500 South African servicemen and women died
- Key battles: the Somme, esp. Delville Wood, Arras, the German Spring Offensive (France), 3rd Ypres (Belgium), the Battle of Square Hill in Palestine, the East African Campaign.

Filikisi



On this day, 16th September 1916, **Filikisi**, a porter with the King's African Rifles died of cerebrospinal meningitis. As with many of those who died in the First World War, we don't have a photograph of him, but here are some of his comrades photographed in 1916. Filikisi was a member of the 4th Battalion, King's African Rifles and probably came from Uganda. He served in the East African Campaign.

Recent research efforts to discover and right historical wrongs around commemoration brought his name to light and we now commemorate him in our **East Africa Book of Remembrance** while decisions about new physical memorials are made. Due to the climate and conditions, 75% of those who died in the East Africa Campaign died of disease.

Key Facts – The war in East Africa

- When the war began, what is now Tanzania was known as **German East Africa**
- From April 1915 Commonwealth forces fought a long and difficult campaign of many small battles and engagements across many thousands of miles through challenging terrain against German colonial forces
- The fighting took place over **750,000 square miles** of land including German East Africa, portions of Portuguese Mozambique, Belgian Congo, and British territories of Rhodesia, Uganda and British East Africa
- About **150,000 combatant troops** were used by the British; from late 1916, largely South African, Indian and other locally recruited troops, like the Kings African Rifles
- More than **105,000 troops and military carriers died**, but the true numbers are unknown

Vincent Geoffrey Pereira

On this day, 16th September 1916, **Vincent Geoffrey Pereira** died in a hospital in north London. He had been born in British Guiana, the son of a medical man.

Vincent was educated in England, before returning to British Guiana to work as a solicitor's clerk. After war was declared, he joined up and was sent to England for training, being based at Seaford Camp on the south coast.

After his training, he was sent to Egypt, but he became ill with tuberculosis. He was treated in hospital before being sent back to Tooting Military Hospital in London. He was very ill and was moved to St Columba's Hospital where he died.

Key facts – West Indies and the First World War

- As part of the British Empire, the islands of the West Indies went with Britain to war
- More than **15,000 West Indians** enlisted, including 10,000 from Jamaica
- Others came from Trinidad and Tobago, Barbados, the Bahamas, British Honduras (Belize), Grenada, British Guiana (Guyana), the Leeward Islands, St Lucia and St Vincent
- Men from the Caribbean served in the West India Regiment and the British West Indies Regiment (raised in October 1915), serving in Africa, France, Italy, and the Middle East

One Day... One Story...

Maurice Albert Goddard

On this day, Private **Maurice Albert Goddard** of the Royal Marine Light Infantry died, the day after his 32nd birthday, on 16th September 1916. Born in Bristol, he joined the Navy a month before he turned 18 having had a job as a printer.

In September 1916 his ship, HMS *Cornwall*, was at Singapore. Maurice was among those given leave to go ashore, but sadly he was lost overboard from the 'liberty' boat returning to *Cornwall* after 10pm. He could not be found in the dark waters and drowned. His body was recovered the next day, and on 18 Sept a funeral party was landed to bury him in Bidadari Christian Cemetery, Singapore. Many years later, graves from this cemetery were moved to Kranji War Cemetery.

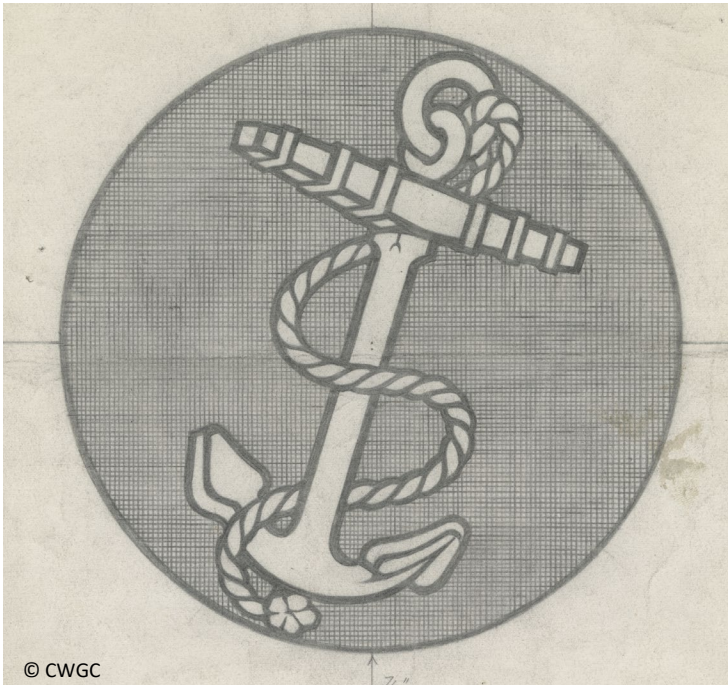
His brother William died at the Battle of Jutland in May 1916 while serving on HMS *Spitfire* and we commemorate him on our Portsmouth Naval Memorial. His other brother, Sidney, died in an accident and is buried in the village churchyard in Saltford, near Bristol.

Key facts – Royal Navy and First World War

- When war broke out, Britain had the largest fleet in the world; British naval personnel played an active and vital role in the Allied war effort and suffered casualties across the globe
- The largest Naval action of the war - the Battle of Jutland – was a 72-hour battle of some 250 British and German ships and over 100,000 men
- Protecting Allied shipping and sea lanes was vital work throughout the war years
- More than **45,000 men and women died** while serving with the Royal Navy during the First World War. Many were lost or buried at sea

One Day... One Story...

Philip J Smyth

On this day, 2nd Lt C.C. Haywood and his observer **Second Lieutenant Philip J Smyth** of No.18 Squadron, Royal Flying Corps were flying over the Somme battlefield when they collided with the cable attached to a kite balloon, cutting it. Lt C.E.N. Cooper of No.6 Kite Balloon Section, on duty in the balloon's basket, was killed when his parachute failed. Haywood and Smyth's aircraft crashed, injuring them both, Smyth severely. He died of his injuries later that day in hospital in Corbie.

Both Philip Smyth and Clarence Cooper had served in the infantry before volunteering for the RFC. Philip was from **County Fermanagh in Ireland**. Clarence was from South Norwood, London. His younger brother Francis would also die serving, two years later. Clarence and Francis are buried 50 kms apart in France.



Key facts – The air services in the First World War

- British military air services began with the use of tethered balloons for reconnaissance, added powered flying machines, then became the Royal Flying Corps in 1912
- The RFC became the Royal Air Force (RAF) on 1 April 1918
- Flying was one of the most dangerous forms of war service: fragile aircraft were easily shot down and often suffered mechanical failure
- During the First World War, British air forces on the Western Front grew from a handful of personnel and just 66 aircraft to over 100,000 men and some 4,000 aircraft
- Over 10,000 Commonwealth air services personnel died

Edward McGiveron

On this day, 16th September 1916, in Senegal, **Edward McGiveron** died. Born in Liverpool, he was a Leading Deck Hand serving on the merchant vessel *SS Karina* which carried cargo and passengers along the West African coast and to the UK. A merchant seaman before the war, he volunteered for military service in January 1915, but was working on a merchant vessel in 1916. He died as the result of a serious fall on board while his ship was calling at Dakar. He was 26 years old and left a young widow, Frances, at home in Bootle.

Just four months before Edward died, his brother John had lost his life serving with the British army in France. We care for his grave in Ecoivres Military Cemetery.

Key facts – The Merchant Navy

- During the war, merchant ships and their civilian crews played a vital role in the war effort by supplying the nation and the armed forces with food, transporting raw materials for the manufacture of munitions, maintaining ordinary cargo and passenger trade, and transporting troops and materiel to fighting fronts.
- Men and women of the merchant service came from all over the world; their ships were the sinews connecting the Empire before the war and during it
- More than **17,000 people lost their lives** through enemy action while serving with the mercantile marine and fishing fleets during the First World War
- Enemy sea mines and submarines were the chief causes of death

One Day... One Story...

John Crawford

On this day, Staff Sergeant **John Crawford** of the Australian Army Medical Corps died of acute appendicitis on board a troop transport ship, HMAT *Miltiades*.

A pharmaceutical chemist from Melbourne, Australia, he had been recruited in July 1916 to serve as a Staff Sergeant Dispenser on board ships transporting Australian servicemen overseas. This was his first voyage. Because *Miltiades* was calling at Cape Verde when John died, his comrades were able to arrange burial on land. The Bishop of Perth, who was on board, officiated at his burial in the small British cemetery and wrote to offer comfort to his mother. John's comrades collected the equivalent of over £1000 in today's money for a stone to be erected over his grave, which was done in 1917 with the help of the British Consul on St. Vincent. We re-paint the inscription every two years, but the sandy, windy conditions on the island rapidly take their toll.

Key facts – troop transportation

- The British Empire's war effort benefited from sources of men and material around the world, but all this had to be moved by sea
- For example, the Australian & New Zealand governments requisitioned at least 178 merchant ships to transport their troops, horses and military stores, to service overseas
- The first Australian flotilla had 28 transport ships. One of these was SS (now HMAT - His Majesty's Australia Transport) *Miltiades*, a passenger and cargo steamer. She would do at least 6 trips carrying troops to the Mediterranean or the UK
- Hundreds of ships like *Miltiades* would criss-cross the oceans, carrying troops and supplies, calling at ports around the globe and sometimes leaving behind a grave or two, reminders of the importance of sea travel that connected the Empire and the war



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
